


HOW TO INSTALL EXCHANGE SERVER 2016 CU11

In this exercise, I will show you how to install Exchange Server 2016 CU11 which was released by Microsoft on 4th Oct 2018.

Download CU11 from Microsoft site – <https://www.microsoft.com/en-us/download/details.aspx?id=57388>

Mount the ISO – Run setup.exe
