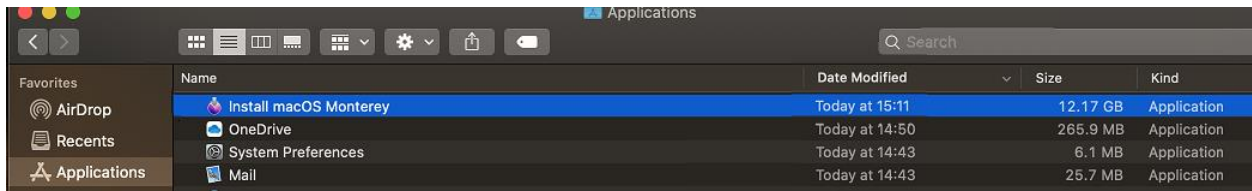
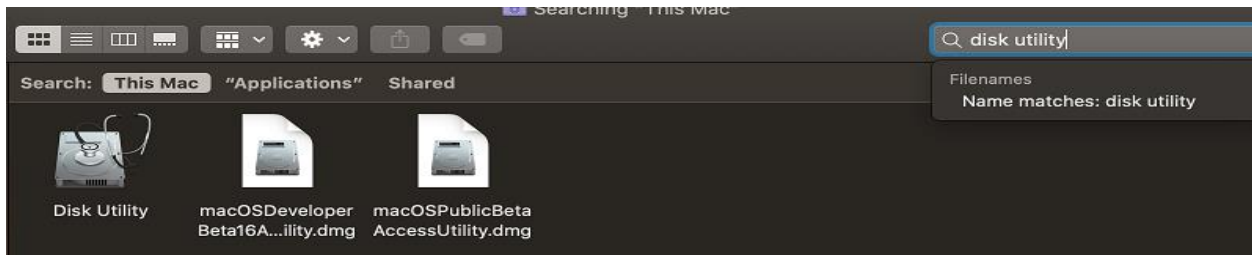


If you go to Applications folder you will see this...

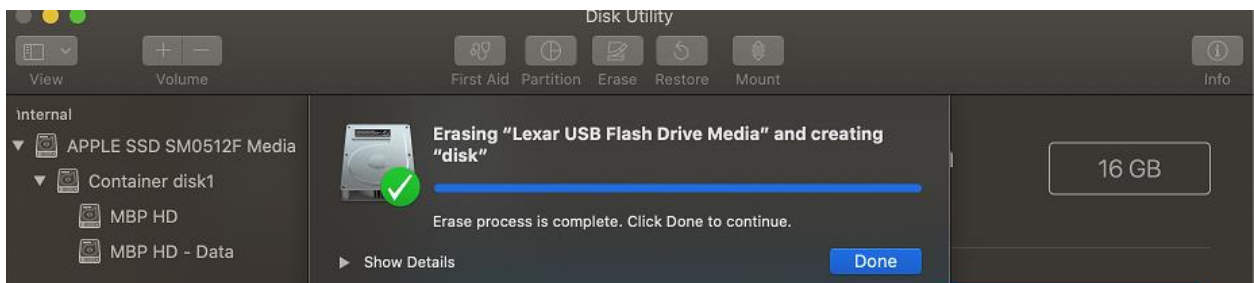


Now plug in USB stick and open Disk Utility. Select USB stick

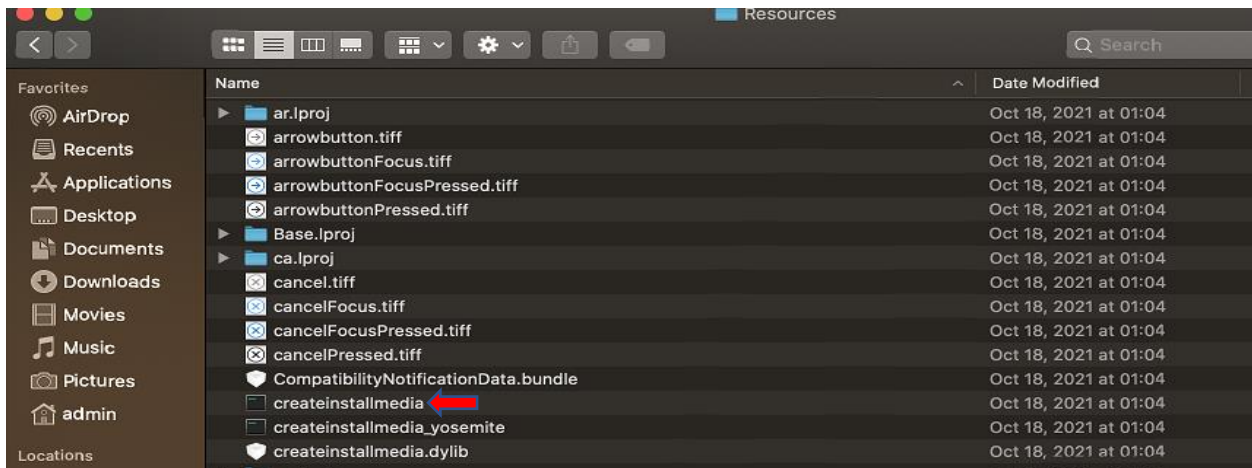
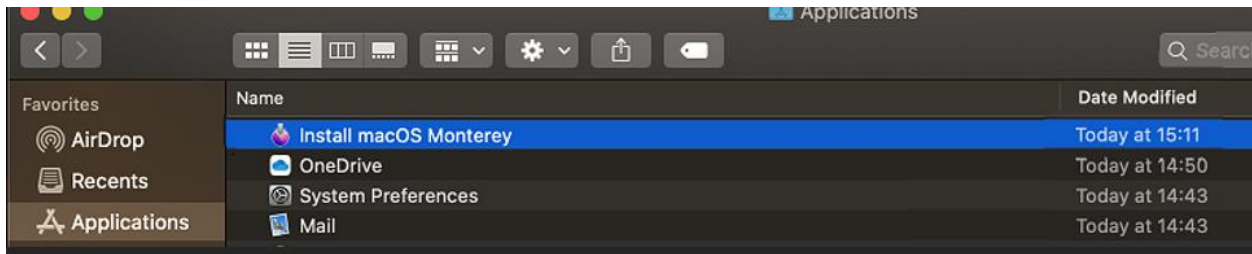


Click Erase



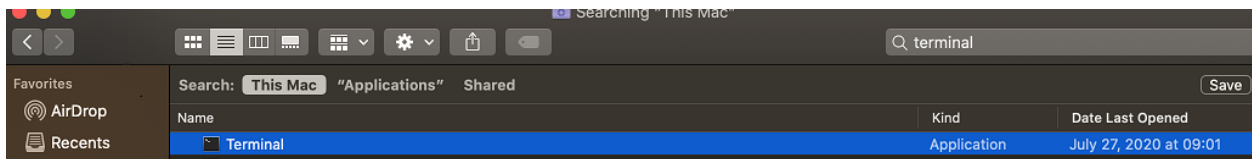


Now open Applications and double click Install macOS Monterey and go to Resources folder

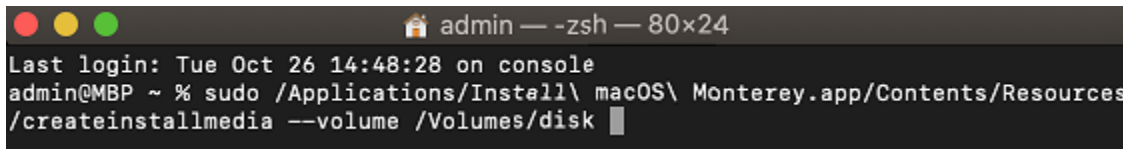


Here we see createinstallmedia command utility which we will be using it later for USB creation.

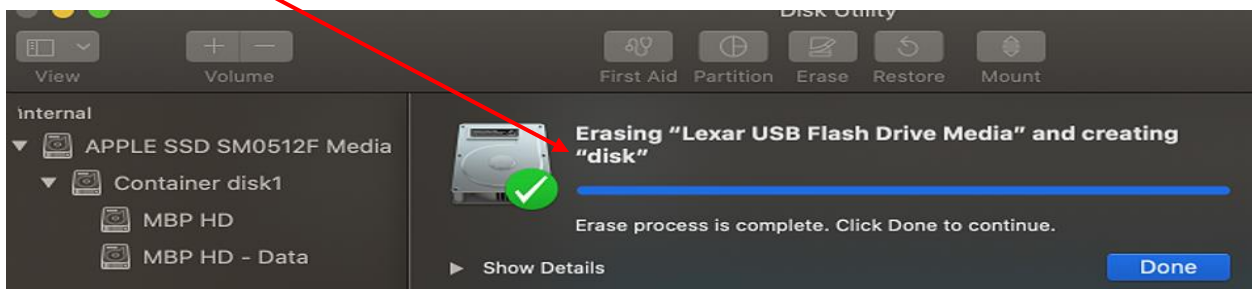
Now open Terminal window



Type sudo and drag createinstallmedia inside terminal window and type --volume /Volumes/disk



The /Volumes/disk is our USB disk



Enter admin password and Press Y

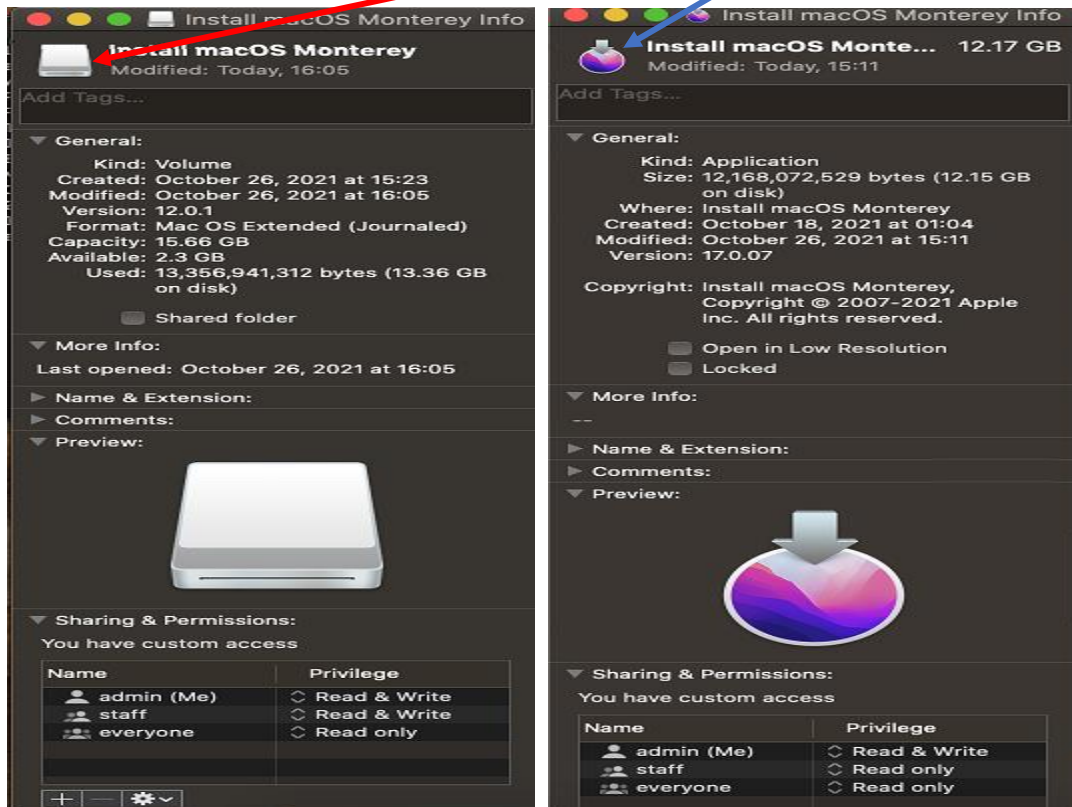

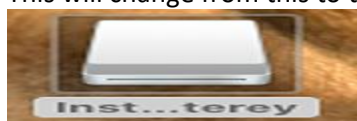

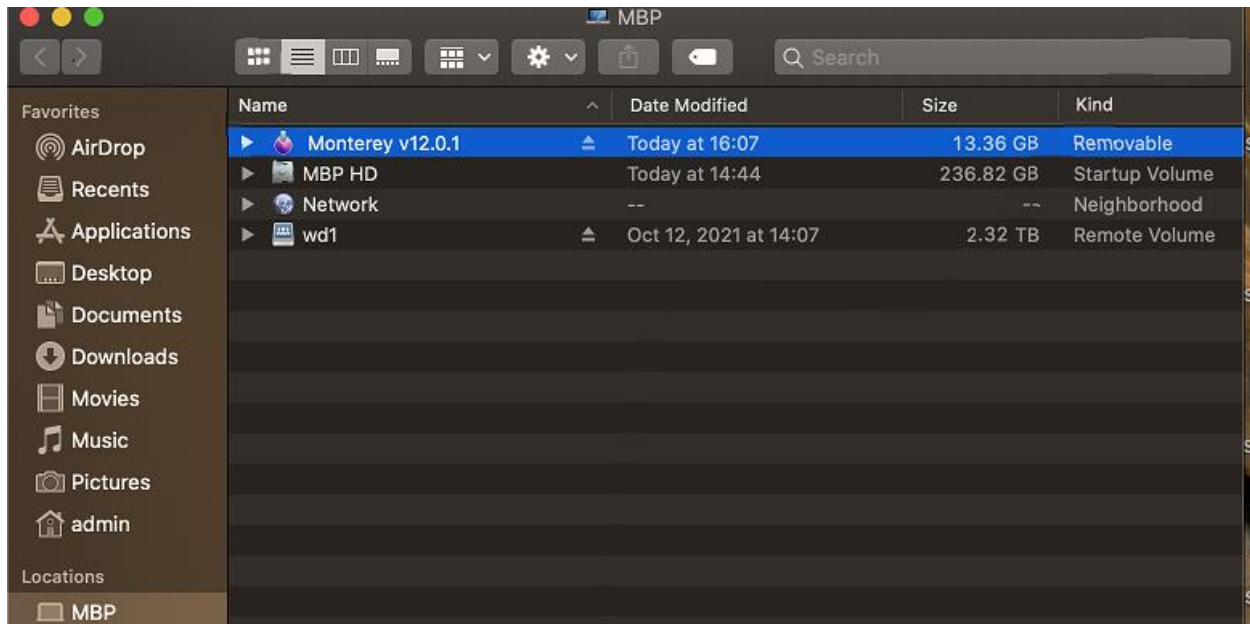
